# THE SIXTEENTH ASEAN AND JAPAN TRANSPORT MINISTERS MEETING (16th ATM+Japan)

9 November 2018, Bangkok, Thailand

#### JOINT MINISTERIAL STATEMENT

- 1. The 16th ASEAN and Japan Transport Ministers Meeting (16<sup>th</sup> ATM+Japan) was held on 9 November 2018 in Bangkok, Thailand. The Meeting was co-chaired by H.E. Mr. Arkhom Termpittayapaisith, Minister of Transport of Thailand and H.E. Mr. Kozo Fujita, Vice-Minister for Transport and Tourism, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism of Japan. The Meeting was preceded by the 17<sup>th</sup> ASEAN and Japan Senior Transport Officials Meeting (17<sup>th</sup> STOM+Japan) held on 7 November 2018.
- 2. The ASEAN Ministers welcomed the announcement of Japan to support the various activities based on the Kuala Lumpur Transport Strategic Plan 2016-2025 in the areas of air transport, land transport, maritime transport, sustainable transport and transport facilitation through projects and activities under the ASEAN-Japan Transport Partnership (AJTP) in a comprehensive and sustained manner.
- 3. The Ministers noted with satisfaction the steady progress of 26 projects implemented based on the AJTP Work Plan for 2017-2018, under the Pakse Action Plan adopted at the 11<sup>th</sup> ATM+Japan in December 2013. The Ministers adopted the "ASEAN-Japan Best Practices on Green Logistics", "ASEAN-Japan Guidelines on Cold Chain Logistics", "Technical Reference for Road Pavement Technologies in ASEAN International Corridors", and "ASEAN-Japan Regional Road Map for Aviation Security (RRMAS)" as key deliverables under the AJTP Work Plan for 2017-2018.
- 4. The Ministers endorsed the AJTP Work Plan for 2018-2019 which would further enhance regional connectivity. The Ministers noted that the AJTP Work Plan for 2018-2019 included the two new initiatives: the "Road Traffic Safety" and "Applying Mobile Data for Transport Planning". The list of projects/activities contained in the AJTP Work Plan for 2018-2019 appears as **ANNEX 1.**
- 5. The Ministers noted the progress in the 3<sup>rd</sup> ASEAN-Japan Consultation on Regional Air Services Agreement (AJC-RASA) in January 2018 in Sapporo, Japan.

The Ministers agreed to task the AJC-RASA to work towards the successful conclusion of a more liberal and mutually beneficial ASEAN-Japan Air Services Agreement with a view to enhancing the air transport relationship between Japan and each ASEAN Member State.

- 6. The Ministers endorsed the result of the Mid-Term Review of the Pakse Action Plan. The Ministers noted that based on the re-examination, the four pillars of the Pakse Action Plan (Transport Facilitation, Transport Infrastructure, Quality & Sustainable Transport and Human Resource Development) remain as they are, with "ASEAN-Japan Port Development Research Project" and "ASEAN 'Mega-Float' Promotion Projects" deemed to have concluded with their initial purpose achieved.
- 7. The 17<sup>th</sup> ATM+Japan Meeting will be convened in Viet Nam in 2019.
